Kalore Cao interest in Catholicism:

Fr. Steven Bell reflection on the Lord's Supper:

The directive Jesus gives in Scripture is affirmed each time we celebrate the Eucharist. "Do this in remembrance of me," Jesus says. Christ himself models the "this" we're supposed to do when we eat and drink. We live as He lived, and we love as He loved.

In a world where lives and love are overcast by arrogance, pride, selfishness, fear, anger, and incivility, we have a model of light who renounced all of these so that all whom he encountered may have full life and may know true love. As we sup, may we recall Jesus' bold model and do the same.

Becky Eldredge reflection on the Passion:

Where do the truths we live by come from? Are they rooted in the Gospel? Are they rooted in Christ? Or are they rooted in the world? Are they rooted in selfish pursuits? Are they rooted in the gospel according to friends, a spouse, parents, or colleagues?

It's easy to get wrapped up in truths that are not from God. We can find ourselves seeking things that appear to be good only to find that they have done nothing but pull us drastically away from Jesus' Father, Our Father. This is not the truth we see today in remembering Jesus' death.

The truth we see today is a man who was rooted firmly in his Father. We see a man who, despite the journey he had to walk, trusted that his Father would see him through it. We see a man who trusted that God would overcome the darkness of his death.

While my journey has not led me to crucifixion, it has led me to events that have brought me to my knees, crying out in despair to God, "Let this cup pass away from me." It is in those moments that we must ask ourselves, "Will we lean on the truth of the Gospel, that light overcame darkness? Or will we lean on the world's gospel, which wants us to believe that darkness is all we have?"

I pray that when we have the choice to make, we can choose to be in Jesus' camp, holding onto the truth in both his death and resurrection.

Sr. Camille D'Arienzo reflection on Easter's Vigil:

The prophet Isaiah encourages us to come to God heedfully so that by listening we may have life.

"Heedfully" seems a relic from an earlier age, but it wisely suggests an attentiveness vital to our spiritual lives to prevent being deafened by the unrelenting barrage of messages that invade our senses daily.

No liturgy has more valuable lessons than those in the Easter Vigil. They span salvation history, as we wait in darkness for Resurrection's light.

Who could blame us if our minds drift to the loving gifts Jesus left us—the Eucharist to nourish us and the washing of feet to model affectionate service for those soiled and weary from life's journey?

And who could blame those among us whose thoughts escape to the message the newly named Pope Francis projected when he pushed aside the ermine trimmed, long red robe, offered him, saying, "Wear it yourself. Carnival is over!"



The famous English mystic, Julian of Norwich:

Suddenly it came into my mind that I ought to wish for the second wound, that our Lord, of his gift and of his grace, would fill my body full with recollection and feeling of his blessed Passion, as I had prayed before, for I wished that his pains might be my pains, with compassion which would lead to longing for God. . . . And at this suddenly I saw the red blood trickling down from under the crown, all hot, flowing freely and copiously, a living stream, just as it seemed to me that it was at the time when the crown of thorns was thrust down upon his blessed head. . . . With this sight of his blessed Passion and with his divinity, I saw that this was strength enough for me, yes, and for all living creatures who will be protected from all the devils from hell and from all spiritual enemies.

Prayer on the Passion by William G. Storey:

Lord Jesus Christ, you were fastened with nails to the wood of the cross and raised on high for all to see. As the sun grew dark and the earth quaked, you surrendered your spirit to your Father, descended among the dead, broke open the gates of hell, and freed those bound in darkness. As angel choirs rejoiced, you were raised to life again on the third day, destroying death by your own death and canceling the power of sin.

By these mighty deeds on our behalf, rescue us from our blindness and tepidity, inspire us anew by your Holy Spirit, and lead us into a life of prayer and service worthy of your awesome sacrifice, O Savior of the world, living and reigning with the Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. AMEN.
