

Pope Francis: Think 'being good' is enough? It's not. Go to Mass

Vatican City, Dec 13, 2017 / 03:20 am. According to Pope Francis, a Christian can't just be a good person and skip Mass on Sundays, because it is the Eucharist that provides the nourishment needed to truly live the Gospel well in our daily lives.

"How can we respond to those who say that there is no need to go to Mass, not even on Sundays, because what is important is to live well, to love our neighbors?" the Pope said Dec. 13.

"It is true that the quality of the Christian life is measured by the capacity to love," as Jesus says in the Gospels, he said.

"But how can we practice the Gospel without drawing the necessary strength to do it, one Sunday after another, from the inexhaustible spring of the Eucharist?"

Pope Francis spoke during his Wednesday general audience, during which he continued his weekly catechesis on the Mass and Eucharist, focusing on the reasons why we must go to Mass every Sunday, besides the fact that it is a law of the Church, which he said is important, but "not enough alone."

Instead we must go deeper: "We Christians need to participate in Sunday Mass because only with the grace of Jesus, with his living presence in us and among us, can we put into practice his commandment, and thus be his credible witnesses," he said.

The Eucharist and Mass, he said, are where we find our strength for daily life.

Without it, Christians "are condemned to be dominated by the fatigue Herald reported. of everyday life." Often consumed by worries and fears, this weekly meeting is where Christ gives us the strength to live each day with courage and with hope.

He explained how participating in the Eucharistic communion with Jesus here on earth helps us to anticipate heaven, where it will be "Sunday without sunset": no more tears, grief, or pain, but only "the joy of living fully and forever with the Lord."

At Sunday Mass we rest from the busyness and work of the week, which teaches us to place our trust in the Father, not in earthly things, the Pope said. In this same way, abstaining from unnecessary labor on Sundays helps us to live out our identity as sons and daughters of God, and not slaves.

The Pope also noted an important distinction about Mass, which is that Christians do not go in order to give something to God, "but to receive from Him what we really need."

This teaching is evoked in a prayer from the Roman Missal, which addresses God, saying: "You do not need our praise, but for a gift of your love you call us to give you thanks; our hymns of blessing do not increase your greatness, but they obtain for us the grace that saves us," Francis said.

Pope Francis then noted that there are some Christian communities which are not able to celebrate Mass every Sunday, but they are still called to gather together in prayer, to listen to the Word of God, and to nurture their desire for the Eucharist.

Alternatively, there are many secularized societies which have entirely lost the Christian sense of an "illuminated Sunday," he said.

In this case we must help revive and recover the meaning of the day he said, which should be celebrated with joy, with community, and with solidarity; as a day of rest "that restores the soul and the body." By Hannah Brockhaus. (Article above is taken from CNA website).

Seminarian who died in bus crash:

He practiced laying down his life daily, friend says. Jason Marshall took action that may have averted an even worse disaster. A seminarian who died in a bus crash last week on the way to New Mexico from a Catholic youth conference in Denver often said that priests have to be ready to lay down their lives for others. Reports emerging from the horrific accident, which took the life of one other person, are suggesting that Jason Marshall did just that. "Priests have to be men. They have to be ready. They have to be shepherds and they have to be ready to stand up and potentially lay their lives down," Marshall would say, according to the recollection of Matthew Gubenski, a fellow seminarian of Marshall's at the Pontifical College Josephinum in Columbus, Ohio.

According to witnesses and the family of Marshall, the 53-year-old tried to regain control of the bus after a reported medical incident with its driver, 22-year-old Anthony Padilla, the <u>Catholic Herald</u> reported.

"He saw the driver in distress, grabbed the wheel and prevented the bus from flipping," Marshall's brother Jeff told Staten Island Live.

Most of Marshall's family lives in New York. Marshall was studying to be a priest for the Archdiocese of Santa Fe, New Mexico.

Though the accident, which took place June 23 near Pueblo, Colorado, is still under investigation, it seemed clear to some observers that Marshall's jumping into action might have made a big difference. Marshall and Padilla were the only ones killed in the crash, out of the 14 passengers on board, including 10 teenagers.

"A bus that big and so top heavy carrying that kind of momentum, it could have been absolutely disastrous. It could have been so horrible," Father Rob Yaksich, a priest of the Sante Fe archdiocese, told local ABC affiliate KOAT Channel 7 News.

Marshall was a chaperone for a group from the University of New Mexico Aquinas Newman Center attending the annual Steubenville of the Rockies youth conference. The charter bus was traveling southbound on Interstate 25 toward Albuquerque when it struck a bridge embankment around 2:30 p.m., according to Colorado State Patrol. The front of the bus sustained significant damage. Emergency workers had to extricate some of the passengers, whose injuries ranged from minor to critical, Staten Island Live said.

At 53, Marshall was an "older vocation" at the seminary—and reportedly had a way of making people feel listened to and loved.

"I knew that he was good at talking to people," Gubenski told the Herald, "but I didn't realize how close everyone there felt with him. You hear stories about St. John Bosco, how every single kid in the oratory felt like they were his favorite. Jason was always ready to listen, and really get you inspired, and help you in whatever way you needed to be helped. And I didn't realize he had done that for so many people."

Marshall was usually the first person in the chapel, and the last to leave, he added. I know that each of us has been inspired to just try to be to other people what we saw Jason doing, Gubenski told the newspaper. (Article above from https://aleteia.org)
